Lesson Title: Curriculum Design and Development

Course Title: Curriculum Development in English Language Teaching

Level: Master's level

Objectives:

- * To understand the principles and frameworks for curriculum design and development
- * To analyze the role of context, needs, and stakeholders in curriculum development

* To design a sample curriculum for an EFL program
