

Title: Introduction to English Language and Literature for French Literature Majors

Level: Upper-intermediate to advanced

Objectives:

- \* To improve students' reading comprehension of English literary texts
- \* To enhance vocabulary related to literary analysis and critical thinking
- \* To develop students' ability to discuss and present their thoughts on literature in English

Materials:

- \* A selection of short stories, poems, or excerpts from English literature (e.g. Shakespeare, Austen, Dickens, etc.)
- \* Handouts with guided reading comprehension questions
- \* Graphic organizer for note-taking and vocabulary building
- \* PowerPoint presentation with visual aids

Procedure:

Assessment:

- \* Participation in class discussion and presentation (30%)
- \* Reading comprehension test (20%)
- \* Vocabulary quiz (20%)
- \* Written reflection on the reading assignment (30%)
